(The wealth of knowledge is indeed the supreme among all wealth as it cannot be stolen by thief, also not be taken away by king as tax, not divisible among the brothers, nor is it a burden and if spent, it always increases.)

'Tamso ma Jyotirgamaya', you being trained educators, have to spread light of knowledge to dispel 'darkness' from this planet earth. So it's time to educate ourselves for future and also spread the light of learning to dispel darkness of ignorance.

You are privileged to get the blessings of Reverend Swami Ji of RKM. They are the enlightened souls who have dedicated their lives for their fellow human beings. It reminds me of few lines that I learned during my school days. **"Vriksha kabhi na phal bhake, Nadi na sanche neer, Parmarath Ke Karne, sadhun dhara shareer."** While saluting reverend Swamis of RKM, I urge my young friends never to lose concern for society. What you have learned here, let that be used for transforming 'Bharat.'

We are a fast-developing nation and we are relying heavily on reaping 'Youth Dividend'. To become a developed nation, we will have to make our country a \$20000 Per Capita GDP from our present \$ 2000, which means we will have to increase our GDP by 10 times. It's a big challenge.

It's tough but not impossible. We will have to increase our skill base. NEP 2020 is committed to transform education sector and you are expected to play a pioneering role in transformation of our country.

By 2050, our population will increase from 17% of the global population to 19%. We will have to increase our global trade share also to commensurate with population increase. Can we look back to our traditional 'Gurukul' system, which, besides strengthening scholastic thinking, focussed on life skills and developing skills that helped them earned their livelihood. Education needs to be directed towards achieving 'Holistic Development' of the learners.

In 1850, our share was 17-20% in world trade. To become a global player, we will have to work to regain our glorious past. We have already overtaken England and are 5th largest economy. By the year 2047, we will be among the top economies in the world.

Bharat has become an example for the world to have sustained its democratic structure. Participation of masses has shown the world that we are heading for an inclusive society where everyone shall have equal opportunity.

Besides focussing on GDP, we also have to maintain 'Green Economy'. We have promised to reduce carbon footprints, and we cannot betray our future generation.

When I meet young professionals like you, I feel fully convinced that future of our country is in safe hands. Swami Vivekananda once said, 'Youth are not use less. They are rather used less'. We have to use the energies and potentials of our youth to the fullest and our dream to be 'Vishwa Guru' shall no more be a mirage.
