Both the proposals of the CFPC were recommended to the Ph.D. RAC for approval.

2. Planning of curricular transactions.

The curricular transactions of the impending academic session were discussed, planned and drafted by the members of the committee. Feedback received from the peer teachers of the college was discussed in detail, based on which the following curricular planning calendar and transaction time table were finalised and approved.

It was decided that the regular classes of B.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes started in online mode due to the Corona pandemic last year will be continued in the same manner i.e. 4 periods per day each of half an hour duration in google meet platform till the college reopens and physical class resumes.

It was also decided that all the Examinations will be conducted in online mode till the Govt. restriction due to corona pandemic persists.

It was decided that the regular classes of B.Ed. and M.Ed. programmes started in online mode due to the Corona pandemic last year will be continued in the same manner i.e. 4 periods per day each of half an hour duration in google meet platform till the college reopens and physical class resumes.

It was also decided that all the Examinations will be conducted in online mode till the Govt. restriction due to corona pandemic persists.

3. Feedback from previous session.

Feedback received from different stakeholders was discussed and analyzed. The committee decided that the analysis of the same is to be placed before IQAC as well as the BoS in their respective meetings.

4. Any other matter.

There were no specific issues to be discussed under this agenda.

The IQAC of our college collects feedback from different stakeholders like institutional heads of internship-schools, employers, teachers, students, alumni on curriculum every year.
